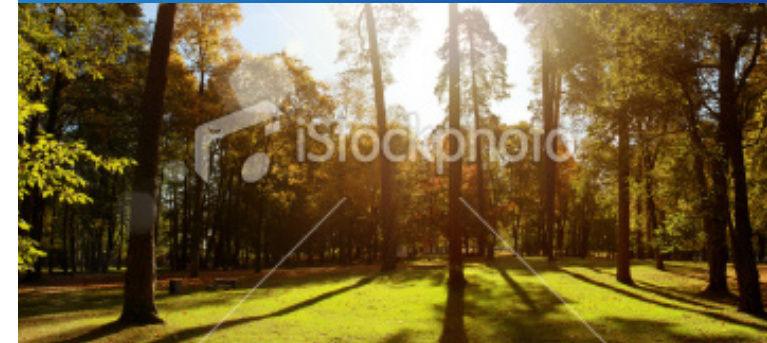

## Victim Support Service Inc

Victim Support Service (VSS) is a community based, not-for-profit organisation, which was the first of its kind in Australia. Most victims' services are government agencies, but we are an independently incorporated body not a government agency.

We have a Board of management, highly motivated professional volunteers and staff who are dedicated to improving the quality of life for people who have suffered as a result of a crime.

Our role is to provide free information, counselling and advocacy services for individuals, their families, friends and the wider community. We also conduct a range of therapeutic support groups for victims, and offer training/consultancy to other agencies.

Victim Support Service was started by, and is still only possible through, the work of its volunteer workforce – helping to publicise our services to community groups, being companions in court, assisting in our library and many other administration areas.

We thank all our volunteers and supporters including: the South Australian Attorney-General's Department, Department of Families and Communities; CPS Credit Union; Community Benefit SA, donors and members for their support.

## We need your financial support:

Crime rates are high and justice and health services are estimated to cost \$32 billion in Australia every year.

South Australian police record about 250,000 victimisations annually and over a million people are affected by crime in South Australia every year.

We assist people who have been affected by any crime from theft or fraud to home invasion, sexual assault and murder. Referrals have increased constantly since 1996 – we need increased funding to assist more victims.

Your bequest will help reduce the shortfall we have between regular income and our operational budget.

We have plans to use your bequest to:

- help address the elderly's fear of crime
- support crime prevention programs
- develop services to victims from diverse cultural backgrounds
- increase counselling capacity
- advocate to improve services to children who are victims of crime
