VSS Chief Executive Julian Roffe said the exhibition gives victims of crime a valuable opportunity for self-expression.

"Many people who have experienced crime find it difficult to articulate how they are feeling, so they use art to express their emotions in the aftermath of crime," Mr Roffe said.

"Art gives victims of crime a safe way to explore their reaction to crime and supports their journey to recovery. It gives victims a voice and enables them to share their stories."

The exhibition will be officially opened on Wednesday 3 August at 5:30pm by the Honourable Dr Robyn Layton AO QC.

The exhibition will run from 4 – 31 August at the VSS Head Office at Level 1/11 Halifax Street, Adelaide. Opening hours are 9am-5pm, Monday to Friday.
